Our Shared Commitment as a Community

- There is no tolerance for writing that is intended to offend, hurt, or harm any member or group, in a manner which is offensive, abusive, or inflammatory.
- Writing cannot contain anything offensive, including words, media resources, links, images, profanity in any language, spam and/or advertising links, and must not violate the parameters of copyrighted material and resources

Submission Parameters

Style and Audience

- Writing should be relevant to an international audience of educators, practitioners, policymakers, administrators, researchers, and school community members.
- Written work should be submitted as individual, standalone pieces. If it is a part of a larger body of work that has been published, please share the link to the original publication.
- Writing style should be relaxed and conversational, yet professional.

Length and Format

- All submissions must be between 500 and 1000 words in length.
- All submissions must be submitted as a Microsoft Word document (.doc, .docx) or contain a link to a Google Document that can be accessed by the editors. PDF submissions will not be accepted.
- Include 1-2 high quality photos to be included in the blog post. Submitted images should be able to be reproduced and published without violating copyright or protection laws. Editors reserve the right to not use the images) provided, or replace the image(s), should there be a question about the source or validity of the image(s) provided.
- Use clear, bold section headers to easily guide readers through the piece of writing.

References

- Use hyperlinks in the text to guide readers to the online sources that are being referenced in the written document.
- If citing a source that is not online, you should use APA style for citation purposes. Visit [Purdue Writing Lab](#) for APA style guidelines.
- Do not use footnotes. Please integrate the material directly into the text.
